## Second Meeting of the Committee

A Meeting was held in the Council School, Campton on Monday, 15 May 1911 at 6.30. Among those present were Sir Algernon Osborn, Messrs G. Hawkins, J. C. Heathfield, F. Roberts, G. Parrott, G. Parrott, G. Ellett, J. Primett, F. G. Hawkins, G. Stanbridge, M. R. Mudie, and the Hon. Sec:

Chairman. On the proposition of Mr G. Hawkins it was unanimously agreed to invite Sir A. K. B. Osborn Bt to accept the office of Chairman, on the resignation of Mr. Anderson. Sir Algernon having <sup>accepted</sup> the chair

Treas. The Hon. Treasurer read his statement of receipts to date, and produced an estimate of probable expenditure.

This was considered very satisfactory. The Chairman announced that he should <sup>be pleased</sup> to contribute the sum of £10 and Lady Osborn would give £5.

Place. An invitation to hold the celebrations at Chicklands <sup>vicarage</sup> was given by Sir Algernon and on the motion of Mr G. Hawkins, seconded by <sup>Mr G. Hawkins</sup> was accepted with thanks.

Date. On the proposition of Mr G. Hawkins seconded by Mr G. Stanbridge it was agreed to hold the celebration on Wednesday 28 June 1911.

Band. Proposed by Mr G. Stanbridge, seconded by Mr F. Roberts "That the Sec. be instructed to engage the Shefford Brass at a fee of £2.10.0 for the afternoon and evening, and to provide tea for them" carried. The Sec. was instructed to obtain sufficient coronation mugs for the children at the cost of 2/6 per doz.

Lunch, Dinner and Tea Committee. Mudie Messrs. Ellett, Stanbridge, together with Hon. Treas and Hon. Sec. were appointed by the proposition of Mr G. Parrott seconded by Mr J. Primett it was agreed to give to those recently left school the option of attending the dinner or the tea. The Sec. was instructed to agree to the offer of Mr G. Flint to provide a treat for the sum of £2. He was also instructed to see Mr G. Tinsley

The Hon. Sec. reported that he had requested the Band to be at Campton Church corner at 1 o'clock on June 28<sup>th</sup>, but the Bandmen say they cannot attend so early unless the Committee provide them with dinner. The subject was discussed and it was agreed that they should be offered an additional 10/- in lieu of dinner.

It was further agreed that admission to Chicksands Priory Gardens should be by ticket, and the Sec. was instructed to provide for this when giving the printing order.

It was agreed that no further meetings <sup>of the General Comm.</sup> was necessary until after the 28<sup>th</sup> June.
